Jicarilla Apache Nation Legislative Council Resolution 2025-R-072-02

LICENSE INFORMATION: This proclamation provides information regarding hunting and trapping opportunities for enrolled Jicarilla Apache tribal members and legally married spouse. Tribal members who live outside of Dulce may apply and receive licenses via USPS mail. All applications must be completed and signed by the applicant; application forms are available at JGFD or can be emailed to tribal members upon request. Applicable license, application and/or stamp fees must be received upon application. Rifle bull elk draw applications require a \$10 non-refundable draw fee; applicable license fees are due by the first day of the hunt. A one-time \$5.00 Jicarilla Wildlife Stamp is required for all Tribal Members (except elders) who hold a license or designate hunt for the license year April 1, 2025-March 31, 2026.

GENERAL LAWS, REGULATIONS, DEFINITIONS, and RULES

NOTICE: In addition to the rules and regulations found in this proclamation, a partial listing of Jicarilla Apache Nation wildlife laws (Title 10) applicable to tribal member hunts are summarized herein. A complete copy of Title 10 is available at the Jicarilla Game and Fish office, upon request.

- 1. OPERATION GAME THIEF: REPORT POACHERS & ILLEGAL ACTIVITY, EARN A REWARD: Rewards up to \$1,000.00 are paid to anyone providing information that results in a conviction for any Title 10 or Proclamation rules and regulations. 575-419-2033 ogt@jan-nsn.com
- 2. Anyone convicted of violating Title 10 or Proclamation rules and regulations, will be subject to revocation of hunting and fishing privileges on the Jicarilla Apache Reservation.
- 3. Take of all game and non-game wildlife is prohibited under Title 10 Code, unless explicitly authorized for take in this hunting proclamation. **Take is defined** as: to harass, harm, pursue, hunt, shoot, wound, kill, trap, capture, or collect, or to attempt to engage in any such conduct.
- 4. It is unlawful to shoot at, pursue, harass, drive or rally wildlife by use of or from a motor-driven vehicle, powerboat, aircraft, including un-maned aircraft (drones).

5. Legal Hunting Methods:

- a. Legal Shooting Hours: ½ hour before sunrise, ½ after sunset (unless otherwise noted)
- b. Centerfire Rifle: minimum caliber for all elk, deer, and bear is .243, and minimum caliber for mountain lion is .22 center-fire. Suppressors are permitted if lawfully obtained with supporting documentation on person.
- c. Shotgun: a smooth-bore gun min. caliber .20 gauge used for firing small shot at short range.
- d. Archery: Hand-held bows, including compound and traditional bows must use arrows with a broadhead (fixed or mechanical). No crossbows or draw assistance devices are allowed. Only legal, hand-held bows are allowed in the field during archery seasons (no firearms). Draw weight of 40 pounds (minimum) is required. Explosive arrows prohibited.
- e. Muzzleloader: Includes rifles in which the charge and projectile are loaded through the muzzle and capable of being fired from the shoulder only. Only black powder, *Pyrodex* or an equivalent substitute may be used. Smokeless powder is illegal. Muzzleloaders may use in-line ignition, pelleted powder, sabots, belted bullets and scopes.
- 6. **Tribal Member**: any individual enrolled as a member of the Jicarilla Apache Nation verified by a census identification number issued by the Jicarilla Apache Nation government.
- 7. Non-Tribal Member: an individual who does not have a valid census number issued by the Jicarilla Apache Nation government.
- 8. Tribal Member Age Categories (at time of application): updated 2021 (Resolution No. 2020-R-080-03)
 - Youth: 17 years old and under. A valid Hunter Safety Card is required to apply for a license
 - Adult: Ages 18-59
- . Immediate Family Members:
 - a. Tribal Member Immediate Family: family members within a second degree of kindred, all of whom are enrolled tribal members of the Jicarilla Apache Nation. Second degree of kindred means a father, mother, brother, sister, son, daughter, spouse, or grandparent.

• Senior Citizen: Ages 60-69

· Elder: 70 years and older

- b. Non-Tribal Family Members: family members of an enrolled Jicarilla Apache tribal member who are within a first degree of kindred but are not enrolled in the Jicarilla Apache Nation. First degree of kindred means a father, mother, son, daughter, siblings, or legally married spouse. Non-tribal family members must be accompanied by an adult tribal member who is an immediate family member for all allowed hunting activities except for non-tribal spouses who may accompany their enrolled tribal member children while hunting.
- 10. **Designated Hunter:** an enrolled Tribal Member who is authorized by JGFD to harvest game for another tribal member (see regulations below). A designated hunter form approved by the JGFD Director or his designate is required and must be carried by the designated hunter while in the field. Designated Hunting authorizations are non-transferrable. Designated hunting is not allowed for: Rifle bull elk, All Deer, Spring Turkey, Horse Lake Mesa Game Park, and once-in-a-lifetime hunts.
 - a. **Cow elk**: designated hunters may harvest an antierless elk (early or late season), field dress, skin, and deliver meat to any other tribal member who requests this service. Tribal member spouses may designate hunt for a cow elk license held by their legally married non-tribal spouse.



- 11. Mobility Impaired: an individual with a permanent physical impairment confirmed in writing by a Medical Doctor or equivalent that:
 - limits his/her mobility to a walker, wheelchair or crutches
 - severely restricts movement in both arms; and/or has combination of permanent disabilities which cause comparable functional limitations Mobility Impaired Hunters can shoot from a stationary vehicle that is not on an established road or highway. Upon clearly wounding a legal game animal, a mobility impaired hunter may be assisted by another person to track, retrieve and/or kill the game. Only the person meeting the mobility impaired requirements will be issued the license, and only this individual may hunt, <u>unless</u> the mobility impaired hunter specifically requests Department Harvest services authorized by the JGFD Director.
- 12. **Tribal Member Guides:** an enrolled tribal member who is hired to guide a non-tribal client during his/her hunt. A tribal member guide is required for most hunts. A maximum of 2 hunters per guide is permitted. Tribal member guides must have a valid driver's license and must be legally able to participate in firearm related activities.
 - a) **Tribal guides may be cited** for acts of negligence, waste of game and other applicable violations of the annual hunting proclamation and/or Title 10 while performing guiding services.
 - b) Tribal members who guide hunters off the reservation during New Mexico State hunts must be licensed by the New Mexico Game and Fish Department. Contact NMGFD at (505) 476-8000 for details.
 - c) Tribal members guiding non-tribal hunters during New Mexico State hunts can only use the following routes to access adjacent state hunt areas: NM 112; NM Highway 537; U.S. 64; U.S. 550; Forest Road 314, Forest Road 357 (Gasbuggy Road); Cooper-Neil Road-south of NM 112; Forest Road 300; Forest Road 301, and J-19 (Lindrith road). All other access to surrounding non-reservation lands is exclusive to enrolled tribal members.
- 13. **Once-in-a-Lifetime License**: A license that can only be issued once in an applicant's lifetime. This license may not be applied for if an individual has previously held one.
- 14. Hard Luck mule deer license: Hard Luck licenses will be honored in 2024, and discontinued beginning in 2025.
- 15. Wound Policy: if a hunter wounds an animal (draws blood) it is the hunter/guide's responsibility to provide specific location and wound information as soon as possible to the JGFD. The hunter/guide cannot pursue any other animal for the duration of the permitted hunt dates, and regardless of whether the wounded animal is recovered, the hunt will terminate.
- 16. No Hunting and Restricted Hunting Zones: areas within ¼ mile of an occupied dwelling and recreational areas when people are present.
- 17. Hunt Guests: During all tribal hunting seasons, non-tribal members cannot accompany tribal member hunters in the field, except for immediate family members (see definition). Any other non-tribal member found in the company of a tribal member may be subject to civil penalty along with the licensed tribal member hunter.
- 18. Tribal member hunters may only hold one (1) of the following licenses per year: turkey, mule deer, bull elk, black bear and pronghorn antelope. Tribal members may hold up to two (2) reservation antlerless elk licenses per season year, but may only hold one antlerless elk license at a time (Second cow elk licenses will be sold/issued upon 1st tag harvest reporting). Horse Lake Mesa hunts which are considered a separate hunt unit thus tribal member application or participation in this hunt does not impact nor count towards reservation bull or cow elk, bear, or mule deer applications or status.
- 19. **License Refunds and Transfers:** The JGFD Director may grant the refund or transfer of a hunting license if: the licensee has died, sustained a severe injury or suffered a life-threatening illness; the licensee has been deployed by the United States military prior to the start of the hunt, prohibiting participation; or a natural disaster has occurred. Requests must be made one (1) week prior to the first day of hunt.
- 20. Extension of hunt dates or application deadlines is not allowed.
- 21. **Shed Antlers and Skulls:** Non-tribal members are prohibited from picking up cast antlers or skulls on the Jicarilla Reservation and from accompanying tribal members who are antler hunting, except for immediate family members (see definition).
 - a. Any skull with antlers attached require a donation permit issued by the JGFD before they can be sold. Possession of antler(s) cut-off from the skull is illegal on the Jicarilla Apache Nation
 - b. Personal shed antler hunting and collection in the Horse Lake Mesa Game Park is prohibited (Resolution No. 2003-R-453-10). Any shed antlers found incidentally in Horse Lake Mesa Game Park must be turned into JGFD.
- 22. **Waste of Game:** All edible portions of harvested game must be transported to a place for human consumption, or provisions must be made to provide for human consumption.
- 23. Skinning Shed:
 - a. The JGFD Skinning Facility is for Licensed Reservation Hunters only
 - b. All carcasses and meat left in the skinning shed for more than 2 days will be forfeited. Requests for additional days will be considered by JGFD but must attain prior approval
 - c. All carcasses or meat in the skinning shed must be clearly and completely labeled with the following: Hunter's name, date of harvest, hunting license number on a meat tag available at the skinning shed or the actual carcass tag from the license
 - d. Citations will be issued to hunter(s) and/or guide(s) and carcasses/meat will be forfeited if found after the allotted time frame, improperly labeled, or if the meat/carcass is in danger of spoiling or has spoiled
 - e. Clean your area: Littering citations may be issued to hunters/guides who do not properly dispose of trash and animal remains after use
 - f. Hunters and guides may be cited for skinning shed violations
- 24. **Possession, Donation or Sale of Game:** Any person wishing to donate meat must supply the recipient with a donation slip available at the Game and Fish Office. It is unlawful to possess game without a proper license or without other evidence the game has been taken legally. Carcasses, meat and internal organs may be donated however it is illegal to sell game meat under tribal and federal laws
- 25. It is illegal to resell any Jicarilla hunting license and; it is illegal to purchase any Jicarilla hunting license from anyone other than the JGFD or authorized vendor (Resolution No. 2000-R-408-10).
- 26. **Licenses and Tagging:** Hunters must sign their license to be valid and must properly notch and sign their big game (carcass) tag immediately after harvesting an animal. The carcass tag must be securely attached to the carcass before transporting in a vehicle. Improperly or untagged carcasses or hides will be seized and the hunter will be cited.
- 27. **Bounty:** Bounty payment is a management tool and is exclusive to enrolled tribal members who legally harvest coyotes and/or mountain lions within Jicarilla Apache Nation lands. Party hunting, submittal of coyotes killed by non-tribal members, off-reservation harvest, and submitting animals obtained



from any other source is illegal, and will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law. Jicarilla Game and Fish Department reserves the right to refuse bounty payment for lions or coyotes of unknown origin, deemed suspicious, abnormal, or evidentiary.

- a. Coyote: pending funds, tribal members who lawfully harvest coyotes may apply for a bounty payment of \$40.00. The full coyote carcass must be brought to JGFD for bounty application, and a coyote harvest affidavit must be completed.
- b. Mountain Lions: pending funds, tribal members who lawfully harvest a mountain lion may apply for a bounty payment of \$200.00.
 - i. A valid carcass tag must be notched and attached.
 - ii. Full mountain lion pelts are preferred for bounty application but full carcasses are allowed. No photos will be accepted.
 - iii. JGFD must receive biological samples and a lion harvest report and hunt affidavit form
 - iv. **Pelt Tags:** All mountain lion hides must be pelt tagged by the JGFD within 5 days of harvest, before the pelt can be frozen, processed, tanned or salted by a taxidermist, or before transporting the hide off of the reservation, whichever occurs first. The pelt tag must remain attached to the hide until the hide is processed.
- 28. SPECIAL PERMIT FOR 24 hours/day PURSUIT: Per Title 10, a special permit is REQUIRED for tribal member lion hunter guides pursuing mountain lions after traditional legal shooting light (night) to allow the use of artificial light. Special permits are available by appointment with Conservation Law Enforcement, and approved by the Director of the Game and Fish Department. 24-hour hunting is only allowed for the pursuit of mountain lions. The pursuit and take of all other wildlife must follow legal hunting hours and regulations, including species associated with dog pursuit such as bobcats and bears.
 - a. Special permits are valid for each season year (4/1 through 3/31). Any tribal member participating in any activities associated with the pursuit and take on a mountain lion outside of legal shooting hours must obtain a special permit.
 - b. Without a special 24 hr./day permit, all lion hunt activities must follow legal hunting hours (½ hour before sunrise, ½ hour after sunset).
 - c. Artificial Light:
 - i. Artificial lights used for scouting, cutting track, or any activities associated with locating a track must be fixed, and have a downward angle that allows the hunters/scouts to locate and identify tracks as they cross a legal right of way (excluding normal use of vehicle headlights). Any other lights that protrude outwards or scan hillsides, flats, etc. shall constitute spotlighting (Class D offense).
 - ii. After a track is located and dogs are released:
 - 1. the licensed hunter must be present when the dogs are released on a track
 - 2. artificial handheld lights may be used to aid in the pursuit and take of the mountain lion
- 29. Only dogs owned and used by enrolled Jicarilla Tribal Members can be used to pursue mountain lion or bear on the Jicarilla Apache Reservation. All dogs used in bear and lion hunts must have tags bearing the name, address and phone number of the enrolled tribal member owner. The licensed hunter with intent to harvest must be present when the dogs are released on the trail of a mountain lion or black bear.
- 30. Any applicant who is a felon per state and federal law shall be restricted to the use of archery equipment only and will be subject to abiding by existing Jicarilla Apache Nation archery qualifications, schedules, and other archery hunting rules and regulations.
- 31. Duplicate licenses (if allowed) for all hunts will be \$10
- 32. NEW! Updated 2025 Archery Qualifications Rules
 - a. **Purpose**: encourage marksmanship, ethics, proper gear selection, and overall proficiency in an effort to minimize wound loss for archery big-game hunts
 - b. Location: Jicarilla Game and Fish Department Office, Dulce NM
 - c. Dates and Time: July 20, 2025 / July 26-27, 2025 / August 2-3, 2025 / August 9-10, 2025; 2pm to 6:30pm
 - d. Draw Weight: Forty (40) pound minimum draw weight will be checked and enforced for all archery hunters
 - e. Distance: Compound: 30 yards, Traditional: 20 yards
 - f. Requirement: Individuals must group 3-arrows within a 7-inch circle, no line cutting, verified by JGFD Conservation Officer(s) in charge, all decisions are final
 - g. Attempts: A maximum of 3 attempts per qualification day will be granted
- 33. Secure Gate Law: it is unlawful to purposely damage or negligently leave a gate unlocked or open when the gate was closed when first encountered or the gate is posted to remain closed at all times
- 34. It is illegal to make false statements when applying, buying, or altering a license, and doing so voids the license.

HARVEST REPORTING is extremely important to wildlife management.

EVERY TIME YOU REPORT YOU ARE ENTERED INTO A PRIZE DRAWING!

All Hunters and Guides:

- Whether successful or not, fill out a Harvest Reporting Survey (tooth envelope) for each license held
- Bring your harvested Buck, Bull for pictures and antler scoring
- Pull lower incisor (2) teeth from all harvested big-game (including Bear and Lion)

MULE DEER

NOTICE: Unprecedented drought conditions and associated impacts to mule deer herds have resulted in large reductions in available buck quotas. MULE DEER HUNTS IN 2025:

- Draw applications will NOT be accepted for tribal member general mule deer in 2025
- The Hard Luck Draw Program has been discontinued; 2025
- Two Year Ineligible Period: All Once-in-a-Lifetime, Archery, Cooper-Neil shall be ineligible to apply for mule deer hunts for two (2) years after holding any of these licenses
- All Deer Licenses (excluding elders) will be issued via random draw
- Elder / Mobility Impaired has a **limited quota of 37**, and will be issued first come, first served to elders whose birth year ends in an odd number. Eligible birthyears for the 2025 elder/mobility impaired hunts will be 1955, 1953, 1951, 1949, 1947, 1945, 1943, etc.)
- Designated Hunting by the community is no longer allowed for any Mule Deer Hunt, this service has been replaced by Department Harvest upon the request of license holder.
- Harvest reporting is MANDATORY for All Mule Deer Hunts- during regular business hours (M-F, 8-5 MST)

RESERVATION ARCHERY MULE DEER

<u>Dates:</u> August 26–September 25, 2025 <u>Bag Limit:</u> One (1) Antlered Buck

License Price: \$50.00 (\$10 non-refundable application fee is required to apply, remaining \$40 license fee is due by August

26th if successfully drawn) The \$40 License fee is waived for Senior Citizens and Veterans

Weapon: Bow only, no crossbows. No firearms can be carried in the field while archery hunting.

Licenses: 5. Issued by Random Draw. Applications accepted July 28, 2025. Archery Qualification Required to Apply.

Ineligible: Hard-luck, Cooper Neal, Archery, or Once-in-A-Lifetime mule deer license holders 2024.

Application Deadline: August 11, 2025 Results: August 13, 2025

Successful applicants are not eligible to apply for mule deer 2 years after holding this license.

ELDER BUCK/MOBILITY IMPAIRED

<u>Bag Limit:</u> One (1) Antlered Buck for License Holders who Elect to hunt for themselves <u>or</u> JGFD Harvest: Management Buck: Cactus Buck, 3x3 or smaller (excluding brow tines) or any mature buck with one antler with 3 points or less per side (excluding brow tines)

<u>Licenses:</u> 37 licenses available (1 per household). Issued first come-first served beginning April 1, 2025 to eligible (odd numbered) birthyears: 1955, 1953, 1951, 1949, 1947, and preceding odd numbered birthyears'). Cutoff: Elder must meet age requirement by the first day of the hunt (DOB: Oct. 11, 1955) to be eligible.

Weapon: Legal firearm

<u>Note:</u> in-person application must be approved by JGFD Director (see reg. 8 and 11 for eligibility). Public Designated Hunting is not allowed. All Department Harvest antlers will be retained by the Dept. and sold at the annual antler auction with proceeds benefiting the Youth Development Fund.

CHRYPTORCHID MULE DEER (Cactus buck)

Dates: Nov. 1-December 31, 2025

Price: \$50.00

<u>Bag Limit:</u> any cactus buck (100% velvet antlers). **Mandatory reporting/bag verification/sample collection upon harvest or end of season, whichever occurs first.**

Weapon: Legal firearm or Bow

Licenses: 5.

Ineligible: Archery, Cooper Neal, or Once-in-a-Lifetime Mule Deer license in 2025. Holding this license will not affect eligibility for any of the 2026 mule deer hunts.

Note: in-person application only. Must be approved by JGFD Director.



COOPER-NEIL ARCHERY MULE DEER LICENSE

License Price: \$50.00 (\$10 non-refundable application fee is required to apply, remaining \$40 license fee is due by

December 12th if successfully drawn) The \$40 License fee is waived for Senior Citizens and Veterans

Bag Limit: One (1) antlered buck

Weapon: Bow only. No firearms can be carried in the field while archery hunting.

Licenses: 5. Issued by Random Draw. Applications accepted beginning July 28, 2025. Archery Qualification Required to

Apply.

Ineligible: Hard-luck, Archery, or Once-in-A-Lifetime mule deer license holders 2024.

Application Deadline: August 11, 2025 Results: August 13, 2025

Successful applicants are not eligible to apply for mule deer 2 years after holding this license. Unit map provided.

ELK

*Tribal members may hold up to two (2) reservation antlerless elk licenses per season year, but may only hold one at a time. Second cow licenses will be sold/issued upon 1st cow license harvest reporting.

ARCHERY BULL ELK

<u>Dates:</u> September 1-25, 2025 <u>Bag Limit:</u> One (1) Bull Elk

Price: \$50.00

Weapon: Bow only. No firearms can be carried in the field while archery hunting. All archery hunters must qualify before

applying for this hunt.

<u>Licenses:</u> 75. Issued first come-first served to qualified archery hunters, beginning July 28, 2025.

ARCHERY COW ELK*

<u>Dates:</u> September 1-25, 2025 <u>Bag Limit:</u> One (1) Antlerless Elk

Price: \$20.00, Free to elders, veterans, mobility impaired and senior citizens.

Weapon: Bow only. No firearms can be carried in the field while archery hunting. All archery hunters must qualify before

applying for this hunt.

Licenses: 50. Issued first come-first served to qualified archery hunters, beginning July 28, 2025

RIFLE BULL ELK DRAW

<u>Dates:</u> Early Season: October 11-17, 2025 (30 Licenses) Late Season: November 18-26, 2025 (30 Licenses)

Bag Limit: One (1) Bull Elk.

License Price: \$50.00

\$10 non-refundable application fee is required to apply, remaining \$40 license fee is due by October 11 (early season) or

November 18 (late season) if successfully drawn

Weapon: Legal firearm or bow.

Licenses: 60. Issued by random drawing.

<u>Application Deadline:</u> August 1, 2025 Results: August 7 Note: 2024 Rifle Bull license holders are ineligible to apply.



RIFLE COW ELK*

<u>Dates:</u> Nov. 6-December 31, 2025 <u>Bag Limit:</u> One (1) Antlerless Elk.

Price: \$20.00 for Enrolled Tribal Members; free to veterans, elders, mobility impaired, and senior citizens

Weapon: Firearm or Bow.

Licenses: 400, Issued first-come-first-serve, 4/1/25

LEGALLY MARRIED SPOUSE COW ELK

<u>Dates:</u> November 6-30, 2025 <u>Bag Limit:</u> One (1) Antlerless Elk

Price: \$75.00 for legally married non-enrolled member spouses of Tribal Members.

Weapon: Firearm or Bow.

Licenses: 50, Issued first-come-first-served, beginning April 1, 2025.

Note: Non-tribal member spouses must be legally married to a Jicarilla Apache Tribal Member. Hunt application must be

co-signed by a tribal member spouse and a valid marriage certificate must be provided each year. Hunter must be

accompanied by an immediate family member who is a tribal member.

BEAR & MOUNTAIN LION

1. Baiting and dogs are allowed for Black Bear hunts

- 2. Only dogs owned and run by Tribal Members are permitted. Non-tribal members are not allowed to run dogs on Nation lands.
- 3. Bear Bait sites must be clearly marked. Color codes are available at JGFD, otherwise the name of the hunter/guide must be visible/legible
- 4. Bait sites must be kept clean of all trash, and cannot be within ¼ mile of recreational areas or houses.

BLACK BEAR

Dates: April 15 – November 30, 2025

<u>Bag Limit:</u> One (1) either sex bear, excluding sow with cubs

Price: \$20.00, free to senior citizens and veterans.

Weapon: Firearm or Bow.

Licenses: 20. Issued first come-first serve, beginning 4/1/25

MOUNTAIN LION

Dates: April 1, 2025 – March 31, 2026

<u>Bag Limit:</u> One (1) either sex Mountain lion, excluding female with spotted kitten(s)

Price: \$10.00, free to senior citizens and veterans

Weapon: Firearm or Bow Hunting Hours: 24 hours/day

Licenses: Unlimited

Date Licenses Available: April 1, 2025

Note: See Regulation 28

Application Deadline: June 6, 2025 Results: June 12, 2025

ONCE-IN-A-LIFETIME MULE DEER

Dates: September 1- December 31, 2025

Bag Limit: One (1) Antlered Buck

Price: \$100.00, (\$10 non-refundable application fee is required to apply, \$90 is due only if successfully drawn)

Weapon: Legal firearm or bow.

Licenses: One (1). Issued by random drawing. Any Jicarilla Tribal Member may apply, except those who have previously

drawn this license. Successful applicant is not eligible to apply for mule deer 2 years after holding this license.

HORSE LAKE MESA ONCE-IN-A-LIFETIME TROPHY COMBINATION

Dates: October 11-18, 2025

JGFD promotes youth hunter safety programs and the Jicarilla Apache's proud heritage of hunting. Enrolled tribal member youth (ages <17) who have successfully completed the Hunter Education Course (certificate/card required) are eligible to apply for youth licenses, except those who have previously held this once-in-a-lifetime license. Successful applicants must attend a pre-hunt orientation before license is issued. Youth must be accompanied by JGFD personnel during the hunt. Note: Youth must receive permission from, or must be accompanied by, a parent or legal guardian. One (1) additional guest is allowed.

Equipment: Offset, steel-jawed, traps. Traps must be checked every 48 hours. Each trap must be tagged with: owner's

name, trap ID#, phone or census number. Catch-pole for releasing non-target animals is required.

Note: 80% passing grade on JGFD trapping regulations quiz (every year) is required prior to purchasing a license.

DOVE

Dates: September 1-30, 2025

Price: \$10.00, free to senior citizens, veterans and mobility impaired.

Weapons: Shotgun; minimum caliber 20 gauge.

<u>Licenses:</u> Unlimited. Federal Migratory Bird Stamp is required for dove hunters over 16 years of age. Jicarilla Wildlife Stamp is not required.

Bag and Possession Limits: Pacific Flyway bag limits apply

- Eurasian Collared Doves (image 3): Unlimited
